Has anyone out-there heard of NEAEK? It stands for something like New England (or North East) Association for the Extermination of Kamatabodies. The Kamatabody is a flying cave creakture which bites; it lives in Albany and Schohaire County New York caves. Bruce Bandall has recently discovered them in Okinawa, so he/we would appreciate any information anyone has.

CONSERVATION

The latest scandal in the National Park circle (since the Park Reservation System, Inc. fiasco) is centered about Yosemite Valley in Yosemite National Park. Remember the TV series 'Sierra'? It was being filmed on location there, and some strange things were happening. Universal Studios, Inc., who was filming the series, is a subsidiary of MCA Inc. Another MCA subsidiary owns 96.5 percent of the stock in the company operating concessions in the Park. The funny things include painting the Valley walls to get better lighting. Anyway, there was a Congressional investigation, which is why it isn't on any more.

A mining company from North Carolina (Sprucepine Corp.) finds wilderness areas "ideal" for dumping radioactive wastes because they "will not be traversed by more than a few hikers" who could be protected from dangerous areas by fences.

Predator Control? Humboldt Co. (California) 1974-75 Predator Control Program pays \$39,210 for three trappers to kill, mostly, coyotes. It is is estimated that coyotes account for less than \$12,000 a year in livestock losses.

The RIVER OF NO RETURN Wilderness Proposel (Idaho) lost something between the regional forester and the White House. More ti. 386,000 acres were deleted from the proposal by the President under pressure from the timber lobby.

To protect portions of the Oregon Dunes National Recreation Areas wilderness is the goal of the Mid-coast Livability Council (Floren Oregon). Off-road vehicle users (ORV's) are fighting to open the entire area to their use.

For those who are interested in the problems created by off-road vehicles, there is a periodical publication called the "ORV Monitor". It is available from the Environmental Defense Council. As far as trying to work out differences between backpackers, etc. and ORV user rather than trying to arouse one against the other, the only positive practical effort is that of the Potomac Appalachian Trail Club. They have published a draft of guidlines for forest management with respes to recreational users, and wish to obtain comments from all user ground Available from: PATC, 1718 N St. NW, Washington, DC 20036.

No Wilderness for Mamboth Cave. In May of 1974, the National Park Service held public hearings on whether or not the surface, underground, or both should be considered for wilderness protection. The response: # 34 supported the NPS no-wilderness proposal, 450 MMKY supported wilderness for both above and underground, 125 were for surface protection only, and 27 for just underground wilderness. Did the Park Service change its recommendation? of course not. All the local businesses stand to benefit by further development of the park. Unfortunately, this will probably destroy any semblance of a balanced ecological systems the care still has. I would like to point out that all of these conservation "shorts" are from the magazines and publications of various groups involved in conservation and the outdoors. Therefore, I have been sending the IOCA NEWS to all clubs that I know to exist, whether or not they have paid dues. However, I know personally of several clubs that get the NEWS and throw it away without reading it. Why? because IOCA social activitie are foreign to them (They enjoy drunken brawls) As far as they could tell (or so I was told) IOCA does nothing else that they would be interested in. I tried to explain that IOCA does other worthwhile things, but I was hard put to find examples.

The paragraph above represents the accumulated gripes of a year of being Exec-Sec. Please don't take it to mean that I hate IOCA, or that I think that IOCA should start having drunken brawls. I think that IOCA has the right idea as far as social activities go, but we need something else in order to be ablr to "sell" IOCA. And don't tell me that IOCA doesn't need to sell itself. If IOCA wants to be an exclusive club, it should change its name.
